

A heroine for children everywhere, fabulous Fiona will steal young readers' hearts in this whimsical tale friendship and perseverance.




Fiona Mask








Join Team Fiona and remember to be strong and courageous, just like Fiona!
















After Fiona learned some basic life skills, who did she want to join?

Note the birth weight of each animal by coloring a bar at the correct pound increment. Make sure to include a title for your bar graph.
